Nestled in the heart of the charming village of Borwick, Pullman House stands as a remarkable blend of timeless architecture and contemporary luxury. Meticulously rebuilt—with only the original front façade retained—this exceptional home is a true picture of craftsmanship and design.

Originally designed in 1887 by the renowned Victorian architects Paley & Austin who also designed Lancaster Railway Station and were involved in the historic Lancaster Cathedral, the building was commissioned as the proposed railway station for Borwick. Though the railway line was ultimately placed elsewhere, its grand architecture remained – a testament to the ambition of its age. Pullman House now combines timeless historic character with modern craftsmanship, creating an exceptional and distinctive place to live.



This impressive stone-built residence offers five generous bedrooms and beautifully balances its heritage roots with modern style and outstanding energy credentials. Enjoying a private, peaceful position surrounded by mature trees and landscaped gardens, the property also benefits from far-reaching countryside views from the first floor. The setting is nothing short of spectacular—offering tranquillity while remaining highly accessible, with the market town of Carnforth nearby, the M6 motorway less than a 10-minute drive away, and direct rail connections to London Euston, Manchester, and Glasgow via Carnforth Railway Station.



As you approach Pullman House, the stunning stone façade immediately commands attention. Spanning over 4,100 sq ft, the interior offers light-filled, open-plan living spaces, herringbone flooring, and elegant finishes that create a feeling of effortless style. Every detail of the home reflects high-quality craftsmanship, from underfloor heating and designer lighting to custom woodwork and stone features.

The main entrance hall is a nod to the property's heritage, with beautifully panelled walls and a feature fireplace offering a superb first impression.

To one side of the main hallway lies a ground floor guest bedroom, complete with a high-spec en-suite shower room. Beyond, a utility room, plant room, and W.C. provide practical living solutions, with the convenience of an external personnel door.

A glazed rear hallway, ideal for use as a library or reading nook, creates a seamless link between spaces and enjoys a peaceful outlook over the adjoining beck.

At the heart of the home is the show-stopping kitchen—a sleek, contemporary design by Siematic, installed by Mark Leigh Kitchens. This space is both stylish and functional, featuring a central island with breakfast bar, integrated NEFF appliances (including double ovens, warming drawer, microwave, fridge, dishwasher, and wine fridge), and feature lighting above the island to enhance the ambience.







The kitchen flows into an expansive 39-foot open-plan family, dining, and living area. A superb space for entertaining or relaxing. Centred around a double-sided stone fireplace, this vast yet flexible room enjoys uninterrupted views over the gardens. In warmer months, the bi-fold doors open fully, for indoor-outdoor living.

A study or snug completes the ground floor accommodation, tucked just off the main living area.

Upstairs, the principal suite is an indulgent retreat. The spacious bedroom boasts a glazed elevation with opening doors, a large walk-in dressing room, and a luxurious en-suite featuring a bath and walk-in shower heated wc and double basins. High ceilings and an abundance of natural light give the space a serene and airy feel.



There are three further double bedrooms, each with its own individual en-suite bathroom, as well as a dedicated storage room and a landing void that adds architectural interest and draws in natural light. The upstairs layout, split between two staircases in keeping with the building's origins as former cottages, offers flexibility with the potential for interconnection to link the bedrooms –perfect for family living.





The exterior is as thoughtfully considered as the interior. The wooded backdrop and adjoining beck create a peaceful and private setting. A large, gravelled driveway leads to a turning circle and ample parking in front of the house, while manicured lawns, stone flower beds, and stone pathways offer the perfect space to be taken to the next level according to personal taste.



To the side of the property, a large garage building (currently under construction) adds even more versatility. This vast space is ideal for parking and workshop use, with accommodation above suited for a gym, home office, or additional living space – whatever the new owners may envision. For those looking for further accommodation, planning is in place for annex accommodation within the grounds.

Pullman House offers a rare opportunity to enjoy a heritage property that has been entirely rebuilt for modern living. Whether you're seeking a countryside retreat, a forever family home, or a residence that seamlessly blends luxury with practicality, this exceptional property truly has it all.

Services: The property has the benefit of mains water, mains electric, heating is via air source heat pump with underfloor heating throughout. Drainage is via private treatment plant.

Unimplemented Planning Consents: The property has planning under reference 23/00971/VCN / 22/00512/FUL for annex accommodation to be constructed within the grounds. The planning is linked to the main build therefore remains extant. Consent is also in place for a substantial detached garage which is yet to be constructed – consent is under 25/00315/FUL.

Mortgage ability: We understand that as far as we are aware it is possible to secure a mortgage against this property.

Title & Tenure: The property is offered for sale Freehold with vacant possession upon completion.

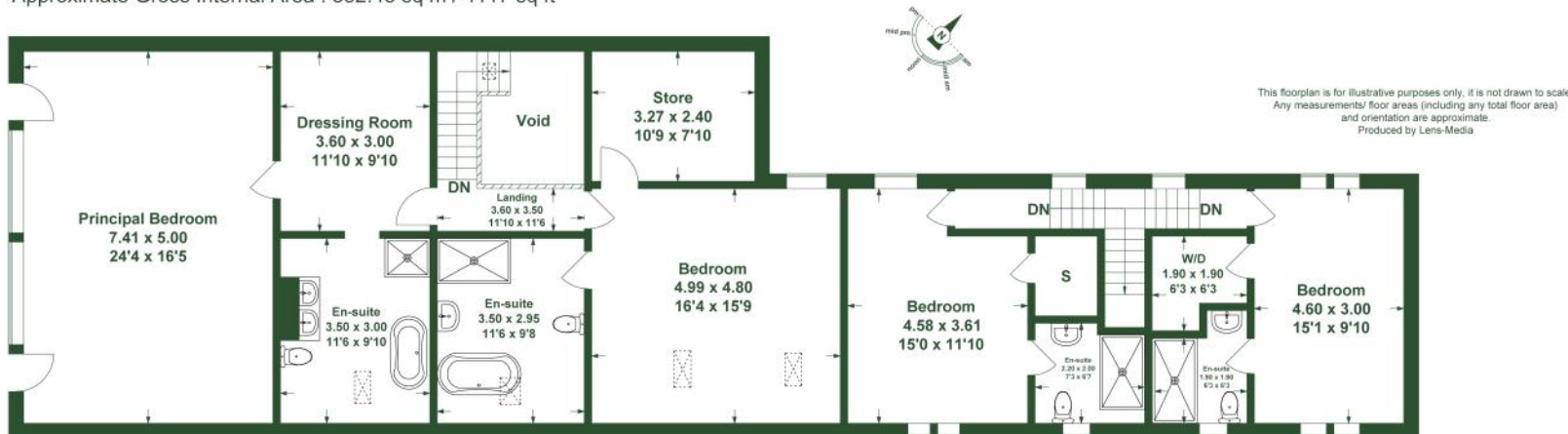
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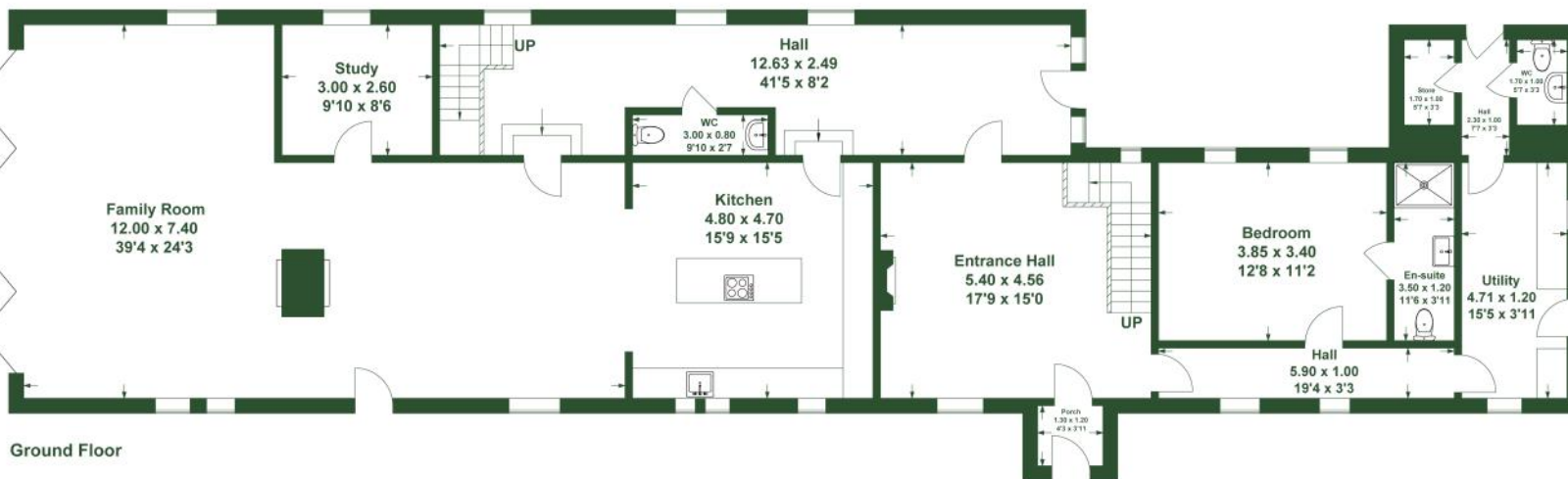
